Stroud Public Schools ARP – ESSER III Plan

Stroud Public Schools has been in meaningful consultation with stakeholders through a community wide meeting held Tuesday, September 28, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. and survey. The following plan resulted from collaborative information from these tools.

Stroud Public Schools will use ESSER III funds to help with prevention and strategies that are consistent with CDC and the State Department's guidance for reopening schools. The school will use these funds to help control the spread of Covid, to help prepare and maintain facilities that are safe and healthy and to increase learning and close the gaps that occurred from the pandemic.

Stroud Public Schools will set aside 20% of the ESSER III funds to address learning loss that may have happened during the pandemic. Stroud Public Schools has consulted with stakeholders including community members, teachers, parents and students to make decisions concerning these funds. The funds could possibly be spent on curriculum, technology, summer programs, tutoring, STEAM summer activities and staff needed to pursue these activities. Many of the programs are being developed to help all students reach success.

Stroud Schools will spend the remaining 80% of the ESSER III funds in compliance with the regulations set forth by the State Department of Education. Stroud Public Schools can allocate these funds from some of the following areas:

- Salaries
- Instruction
- Guidance and Counseling
- Curriculum
- Technology
- Cleaning Supplies
- Library Media Services
- Ventilation
- Facilities Improvement
- Student Assessment
- Security
- Insurance
- Transportation

Stroud Public Schools will ensure that the money being spent from these funds will follow all State and Federal guidelines. These funds will help respond to the academic, social, emotional and mental health needs of all students and especially those who have been impacted by Covid-19, low income students, English Learners, children with disabilities, homeless and minority students. As the year progresses, monitoring will continue to assess the needs of all students at Stroud Public Schools.
